AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND RATIFYING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A LETTER AGREEMENT WITH OHM ADVISORS FOR A STREET SIGN REPLACEMENT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$33,700.00, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Village wishes to take an inventory of its street signage, develop concepts for new street signage and replace ageing, damages or missing street signs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE VILLAGE OF NEWBURGH HEIGHTS, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:


Section 1. Council hereby authorizes and directs the Mayor to enter into a Letter Agreement with OHM Advisors for performance of a Street Sign Replacement services at a cost not to exceed \$33,700.00, which Letter Agreement shall be in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, and which exhibit is incorporated herein by reference as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal action occurred in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the Village of Newburgh Heights, such emergency being the need to provide street signage and update and replace existing, damaged and/or missing street signs; wherefore, provided it receives the affirmative vote of four (4) or more of the members elected or appointed to this Council, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest time allowed by law.
