AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A SUBGRANT AWARD AGREEMENT WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$41,334.85 TO REIMBURSE THE VILLAGE FOR THE PURCHASE OF POLICE BODY CAMERA EQUIPMENT AND ACCEPTING SAID GRANT AWARD, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio office of Criminal Justice Services/Department of Public Safety has approved the Village's grant application in the amount of \$41,334.85 for the purchase of Police Department body camera equipment; and

WHEREAS, the grant funds will be reimbursed to the Village following the purchase of the body camera equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Village wishes to authorize the Mayor to enter into the Subgrant Award Agreement with the Department of Public Safety and wishes to authorize acceptance of the grant funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF NEWBURGH HEIGHTS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO, at least two-thirds of all the members elected thereto concurring, that:

Section 1. The Village Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into a Subgrant Award Agreement with the Ohio Department of Public Safety, for reimbursement grant funds in the amount of \$41,334.85 for the purchase of Police Department body camera equipment, which Agreement shall be in the form set forth in Exhibit A hereto, which is incorporated herein by reference as if fully rewritten.

Section 2. The Village Council hereby authorizes acceptance of grant funds in the amount of \$41,334.85 for the purchase of Police Department body camera equipment.


Section 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal action occurred in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby determined to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the Village and its residents, the emergency being the need to enter into the Agreement as soon as possible so that the Village can purchase the updated body camera equipment for the immediate benefit of officers and the community. Therefore, provided it receives two-thirds (2/3) of the vote of all members of Council elected thereto, said Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption by the Council, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


